HYDRATION DONATION GOES TO DISASTER VICTIMS IN SOUTHERN USA

Hilton Head Island, S.C. – May 6, 2011: Cera Products, Inc. announced its donation of 6,480 CeraSport EX1® drink boxes, valued at nearly \$9,500, to Direct Relief USA to help communities in Alabama and other areas throughout the South affected by tornadoes. The drinks will help prevent dehydration in areas being rebuilt. The initial shipment was sent to Etowah Free Community Clinic in Gadsden, AL, where an estimated 3,000 people displaced by flooding are being supported. Alabama was declared a Category One disaster area: the same ranking given to Hurricane Katrina and the 9/11 terrorist attacks. Thousands remain without power and cannot access, cook or store food. Gluten-free CeraSport® oral rehydration drinks do not require refrigeration or special storage.

“We are so glad to have the opportunity to help our neighbors in Alabama, who are recovering from one of the most terrible storms seen in many years in that part of the country,” says Cera Products President Charlene Riikonen. “It is our mission to prevent and correct dehydration, so this is really important to all of us at Cera Products. We have been helping all over the world, so when such a disaster strikes our fellow Americans, we find it all the more important to help.”

Direct Relief has delivered medical and other supplies to health facilities in Arkansas, Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, Missouri and Tennessee through its nationwide Safety Net Support program. Emergency shipments have also been provided to North Carolina and Arkansas following tornadoes that struck those areas in April. On May 12, Direct Relief will meet with Cera Products in South Carolina to discuss future plans and opportunities to provide oral rehydration to people and communities affected by disasters worldwide.
